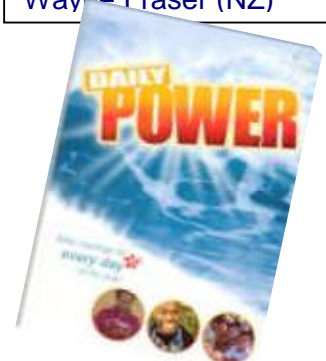

Pacific Islands

- **Gospel ship Visits Fiji**

The MV Doulos arrived in Fiji in partnership with the Bible Society on May 23rd to the 4th June 2008. The Schools' team ministered in the Western & Central Division. This was a great source of encouragement to students and teachers in the schools.

- **All things to all**

When Glenn Coombs in NSW discovered a French speaker interested in mission it sparked an idea. As a result a French language mission team from NSW will visit the **Vanuatu** islands of Efate and Malecula in July to minister in French speaking schools and churches. And reports being received are that the campsite continues to be well maintained and utilised for ministry.

- **Mentoring program on track**

The **Solomon Is HIVAids Peer Mentoring project** is going very well. A dedicated team of students, teachers, volunteers and council members are on track to ensure this pilot will happen over the next five months. The key to this coming about has been the student council and



in particular these two young ladies who have a goal of training to become doctors. Their passion to be involved is quite amazing and this extends now to the whole team. They long for this generation to be educated and to talk openly about this modern day LEPROSY. SU Tasmania and SU Int. have made financial contributions to this project. The strategy is: 1/ plan well. 2/ network with schools, churches and the community. 3/ prayer warrior team. 4/ provide resources. 5/ make it happen.

- **Students reached in Tongan Schools**

The March quarter started off with a **Weekend Retreat** (28th -29th March) of the Vava'u SU school groups, comprising of Vava'u High School and the Methodist Mailefihi/Siu'ilikutapu secondary schools.

This is the first time an SU retreat has been held there, and it was a real blessing to both students and staff involved. SU staff, were able to visit both schools and conduct worship and strengthen the SU groups. Both school Principals fully supported the SU activities in their respective schools.

The Director was also able to visit 'Eua Island and fellowshiped with 'Eua High School and also Hofangahau College in April and encourage the SU groups there. In both Vava'u and 'Eua schools, many students responded to the gospel and vowed to follow Jesus for the rest of their lives. A special emphasis was made on the importance of committed daily Bible reading and obedience to God's message for each and everyday. God willing, **Sitiveni** plans visit the Ha'apai schools in July.

- **Wedding bells**

Sat 21st June saw **Walo Vali**, the SU Director in **PNG**, joined in marriage to *Nopiri*. Ministry in PNG is growing with Walo's extensive visitation program and the development of camping ministry.

Late last year a SU student from Della Sale was almost chopped to death by some intruders. He innocently carried the burden of his mates. During the beginning of the school year the Della Sale Secondary school hosted inter-school prayer at their school. This young boy shared his testimony fearlessly acknowledging the hand of God that brought him back from death. He made a commitment to honor Christ in his life time and is now an active Scripture Union member.

New Zealand

- **Its all about serving**

The New Zealand schools ministry team successfully ran their **YouthServe** event during the last holidays with a large team in Auckland and smaller group in Christchurch. The idea behind YouthServe



is to practice and reflect on the concept of Christian serving by bringing together young people who are prepared to get their hands dirty working alongside and for the community, and then spending time opening the Bible to explore how it informs their practice. The teams were able to see what a difference one person serving another can make. Hopefully the participants are able to build this value and attitude into their everyday lives so that they reflect the authenticity of Jesus, the supreme example of service. It is hoped this concept can be duplicated around New Zealand and eventually... the Pacific, who knows?

Australia

- **Changes occurring in SUA Resources**

SU Australia mission is to “*support and nurture the mission of SU in Australia*”. A key supporting role is to provide printed resources with a particular focus on Bible notes. To more adequately address the challenges to promote Bible engagement in the current and emerging cultural environment, SUA Resources For Ministry is undergoing some significant changes. A new Bible engagement group (BEG) is being developed and changes will be made to the way in which other published resources are provided to the market. **Kevin Hooper** has been appointed to head up the new initiative and commenced on 1st July.

- **The new man out west**

When *Glen Simpkins* took on his new role as Director of Scripture Union in the Northern Territory, the search began for a suitable replacement to continue coordinating and growing Scripture Union ministries in the North West and Central West of NSW. To better serve this geographically huge region **Scripture Union NSW** has broken the existing role up into two part time positions, one



coordinating ministry in the North West, the other based in the Central West. Part of that search is over!

SU NSW are delighted to welcome **Sam Eriksson** to the team as Ministry Coordinator in the North West. Sam is an energetic and passionate young man with a heart for sharing Jesus with the people of regional NSW. Sam commences in the role in July, and will hit the ground running with many

programs and initiatives already in development. The NSW team is excited about building on the foundations laid by Glen Simpkins and growing the ministry in this part of the state.

- **And there is more....**

SU Victoria is passionate about seeing the next generation transformed by God – but it is ***much more*** than a passion. It is what the teams eat, sleep and dream! It is the cry of SU Vic’s hearts that “none should perish”; that 94% of children and young people the church is currently not reaching will hear God’s good news. Ezekiel 47 gives an incredible picture of what **ELEVATE** - SU Vic’s school strategy - is on about.

Ezekiel describes a river flowing out of the temple *“through the desert into the Jordan Valley, where it enters the Dead Sea.”* This river carries God’s life from the four walls of the temple where it has been kept (the church), and carries it into the most arid, dead and lowly places on the earth, bringing abundance and life (God’s Kingdom). *“Wherever this water flows, everything will live.”* Fish will abound where there were none and fishermen will be released with many different nets! Fruit trees will spring up, bringing healing and food for the nations! This is what they long to see!

- **Love in words and action**

SU Tasmania runs most of its camping programs in the winter holidays in June and September. Over the last few years they have seen a rising number of children referred by social services to the events. Some of these children are fostered and the camp provides respite for them and their Carers. Others are already far down the track of being in trouble with the authorities and must have the police sanction their attendance. It is wonderful to see SU Volunteers and staff spending quality time with these young people, showing them as well as telling them, that God loves them no matter what their circumstances are.

- **Indigenous ministry is making a difference**

THE role of any **SU Queensland** chaplain is a challenging one as they deal with young people's conventional and not-so-conventional crises on a regular basis. Yet some "chappies" choose an even tougher road, devoting their time to young people in remote towns and indigenous communities.

Why do they choose this role and how do they cope in such situations? **Mark Shields'** experiences in Cherbourg, a small indigenous community 250 kilometres north-west of Brisbane, have often been challenging. He has seen first-hand the tragic effects of hate, grief and aggression in both children and adults in the community, including abuse, neglect and issues such as petrol and paint-sniffing. But while he admits these problems break his heart, he refuses to be daunted by his experiences and is keen to continue his time as chaplain at Cherbourg State School as well as at neighbouring Murgon State School.



"After working here for only one term, they run up and jump all over me when they see me, and they hang around me for as long as they can," he said. "They know I'm not in a disciplinary role, and they really like the fact that they have a grown up to play with who supports them and is a fun guy. My experiences here have been pretty full-on and it's been a huge learning curve but it's also been really rewarding and I'm glad I'm here."

- **Seminar with a wholistic focus**

Originally designed by **SU South Australia** as part of the integrated POV Program (involving seminars, lunchtime activities and a camp), the **Global Connections Seminar** is finding use as a stand-alone resource. The seminar uses activities, up-front presentations, small group work, and investigation of the Bible (each student receives a copy of Luke's Gospel) to discover the person of Jesus and what he has to say about how our attitude toward God affects how we view and use our possessions.

By tapping into a 'hot' topic for school students this seminar is able to demonstrate that Jesus is interested in the whole person, not just the 'spiritual' dimension. In the words of one student at Cowell Area School on South Australia's Eyre Peninsula, he came to the conclusion that 'God's a great man!'

- **SU ministry was Convention focus**

Katherine Christian Convention (KCC), primarily an annual indigenous/missionary convention over the May long weekend, was an event where **SU Northern Territory** and **International** were both featured. The overall theme for the convention was “*Jesus the life changer*”. On the local level, SU ran the kids program which is always a real privilege. New **Glen Simpkins**, the new Scripture Union **Northern Territory Director**, had a great opportunity to showcase SU and the ministries over the course of the convention. On the international level **Clayton Fergie**, past Director for SUNT and current **SU International Youth Consultant**, was the keynote speaker, challenging people to tie up unfinished business with each other and with God, and to allow God to transform them through His Holy Spirit.




Many **resources** were also featured in the purpose-built SU trailer, which helped many missionaries see what SU had to offer and the ways in which SU could support them in their ministry.

A Training day for SUPA workers was held on 28 June. A new Adventure Camp for older teenage boys planned for 15/16 July and a Camps ‘think-tank’ is to be conducted on 26 July. SUACT moving to new premises in July - very exciting! And a Prayer Day is scheduled for 18 August.
